The skies tell of the glory of God: A meditation

The Psalmist declares - The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork. (Psalm 19:1)

Today I would like you to join me on a journey through the skies and contemplate the glory of God.

In our time together I will offer you both a image of and some comments on the elements of the sky and invite you to contemplate what you have seen and heard for a moment or two.

<u>Skies</u>



So, God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome. And it was so. God called the dome Sky. (Gen 1:7-8) Consider the vast expanse of the sky.

Sunshine



In the heavens he has set a tent for the sun, (Psalm 19:4)

The sun's rising is from the end of the heavens, and its circuit to the end of them; and nothing is hid from its heat. (Psalm 19:6)

Each evening the sun sets, calming us and calling us to rest.

Rest in God for a moment.

Moon



God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth, to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. (Gen 1:17-18)

Moonlight softly shimmers on the waters, bathing them in a gentle light.

Lighting our darkness, controlling the ebb and flow of the tides.

We try to colonise it, yet it continues to provide for us.

<u>Stars</u>



God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. (Genesis 1:16)
